About

Bryan High is a diverse high school in Bellevue, Nebraska, part of Omaha Public Schools. The school serves students in grades 9-12. Bryan High serves more than 1,800 students representing various ethnic, cultural and economic backgrounds. Bryan High, in partnership with students, families and the community, provides a student-centered learning environment that cultivates character, embraces diversity, fosters academic excellence and prepares students for post-secondary opportunities and career readiness.

All Bryan High students begin their journey with the Freshman Academy, which helps them build the skills to succeed during their high school career and explore career interests. Students select an academy from one of the overarching themes during their freshman year.

The overarching academy themes at Bryan High are:

- · Design and Construction
- · Distribution, Transportation and Logistics
- Education
- · Urban Agriculture

In an academy, groups of students with similar career interests take classes together. All students take core courses in English, math, social studies and science, along with career-focused classes and electives. Career-focused classes proceed from one to the next in a series. Students can take advanced academic courses (Dual Enrollment, Advanced Placement and Honors) to supplement their academy and core courses. All students participate in the small learning communities, experiential learning and capstone projects.

Bryan High operates on a block schedule model. Students have only four classes per day and now earn the same amount of credit, that would have taken a year, in eighteen weeks.

<u> History</u>

Bryan High was named after Nebraska politician William Jennings Bryan. Bryan High opened in 1971 however, the history began during the 1964-1965 school year when students first began taking classes at what is now Bryan Middle. Bryan Middle was originally designed as a junior-senior high with the first class graduating in 1968. Increasing enrollment led to the need for a separate high school, thus a new school was built and opened. Recent renovations continue to enhance the learning environment for students. Bryan High has a history of innovation and change. That tradition continues.

Logo



Logo is the graphical representation of an organization. It is the first impression others have of our school. Bryan High's logo incorporates the school name and the image of the mascot a bear arranged as you see here.

The school name arranged as you see is a logotype, it is a brands name set in a special typeface in a particular way. The Bryan High logotype can be used alone. The bear image alone is considered an icon, a representative symbol. The bear head must always be straight, never tipped or rotated. The head should be placed above or to the left of the Bryan High logotype, never alone.





Stretch or scrunch.

Use elements on backgrounds that don't have contrast.

Give the logo some space around it — about equal to the "H" in school.





Don't

Make it so small that it is difficult to read.

Bryan High has the largest Future Farmers of America (FFA) Chapter in the state of Nebraska.

Transportation, Distribution and Logistics students partner with the Food Bank of the Heartland to package, and assist in distribution of food packages for smaller distributions centers across the state.

In 2018, Bryan High's Urban Agriculture Academy was named a model academy by the National Career Academy Coalition.

Transportation, Distribution and Logistics students have the opportunity to graduate with a 10-hour OSHA training certification and possible forklift certification.

In 2019, generous private funding allowed Bryan High to build a new distribution center and greenhouse on site.
